Bryan Neale and the Importance of Vulnerability

Lessons on leadership and life for the final evening of HOBY Indiana 2019

On Saturday evening, Bryan Neale challenged HOBY ambassadors to be open about what they wanted to improve upon as an individual leader. Neale explained that the only thing we can control in our lives is how we react to external events. Through an exercise in which the audience wrote to a person they were harboring resentment toward, Neale helped the audience see how important it is to communicate with whom we are struggling. As he stated, “resentment is like swallowing poison and expecting the other person to die.” Thus, we must come to terms with our conflicts. Furthermore, he claimed that vulnerability is the ultimate sign of strength and proved this by asking volunteers to dance on stage! Each ambassador began with hesitation, but eventually embraced the experience as the audience kept cheering. Neale explained the point of the lesson: your audience does not want you to fail. Through a personal story, he urged the audience to reflect on the present, gratitude, and the positive aspects of our lives. Neale listed the lessons he wished he had learned at a young age: to know yourself, to choose constructive conflict over harmony, to choose vulnerability, and finally, to live in the moment!
